#### **Extra-curricular Activities:**

I was scouted by members of the cyber defense club due to my CCNA certification and provided help during the MACCDC competition. When possible, I tutor students in computer science related courses. A favorite achievement of mine was helping four high-school students pass the CCNA certification exam.

## Notable Experience:

I had an internship with Cisco Networking Academy where I was responsible for maintaining a lab environment consisting of windows 10 computers, cisco routers, and cisco switches. I provided help to high school students during lab exercises in preparation for their CCNA exams. This internship had a profound impact on me.

The one experience that I want to focus on was the time we had received all new routers and switches. It was my job to switch out the old devices for the new, however, before installing the devices, I checked their configurations to ensure everything worked as intended. Nothing was working as intended. It turned out that we had been sent the wrong operating system. We received an SDN data plane operating system which meant the devices could not be configured locally and instead required a SDN controller to operate. Through much trial and error, I was able to discover this fact, remove the incorrect operating



system, and install the correct one.

It is fair to say that this experience taught me a great deal of patience. Despite the issues I encountered during the internship, I was not dissuaded to pursue a career in IT. I actually grew to enjoy sitting in that lab working through those problems. Admittedly, I had my reservations before taking the internship, but I genuinely believe it changed my life for the better.

### Career Plans:

I am pursuing a career in cloud networking. Originally, I had intended to work on traditional network architectures, however, given that the industry has trended more toward cloud based technologies, I believe that it would be in my best interest to start in cloud networking as soon as possible. This does not mean I am adverse to taking a job working on traditional networks however as I am well aware how difficult finding your first job in IT can be, but I do hope to get my start in cloud networking sooner rather than later.
